

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I love a good mystery. I couldn't help but step into Alan Alda's exploration of Marie Curie. Radiance celebrates the joy of discovery and I have had the opportunity to tackle a profoundly intricate text with a cast that was just as eager to go on the journey. Artists, like scientists, rarely approach work for monetary gain, yet wrestle with the work, emotionally, physically, spiritually to find a glimmer of truth distilled out of this dark, murky world. The end result might be glorious or painful or somewhere in between, but we revel in the wonder and the mystery of the work. My geekiness made me fall in love with this play—Alan Alda & Marie Curie—how could I not fall in love? Alan Alda is one of the few people who have helped me to respect science, through Scientific American Frontiers, even though it was my most painful subject in school. In addition, the opportunity to share a strong female character, who struggled against prejudices of gender, race, and nationality was both irresistible and frightening.

I debated with myself for a long time before deciding to make this play the company's first full production. I needed to let this play's light shine and I took the leap into the unknown. I found actors and creative staff who were glimmering and just waiting for a chance to shine and I got the opportunity to encourage them and help them see their lights (hopefully) a bit more clearly. What did we find? A joyful adventure, a supportive community, dangerous corners, new perspectives, and new questions. Thank you for joining us on this journey! I hope you find something that sparks your creativity and curiosity through this new experiment for Swiftly Tilting Theatre Project, Inc.
